Welcome Rabbi Sonia Saltzman



The anticipation in Penn-Spero was palpable this past May at the special meeting called to meet the candidate recommended by the Rabbinic Planning and Search Committee. Our congregation was about to have its first opportunity as a community to see the new rabbi. What would she be like? How would she connect with people? What would she say? The introduction was impressive...an unusual background... a mature person with interesting experiences and history, clearly well-educated. She was familiar with the Boston area, as she lives in Newton with her husband and their two sons, and has other members of her family who live nearby.

Rabbi Sonia Saltzman then took the microphone. She spoke words of Torah and tradition and explained her path to the rabbinate and to TOS. Hers is an uncommon story, beginning from her being raised in Chile, and winding its way through an education at Tufts University, followed by graduate school at Columbia, leading to a successful career in business. And then she followed a calling to become a rabbi. Ordained by Hebrew College as a rabbi and possessing a graduate degree from Brandeis University as well, this was a woman who valued learning and study. She spoke with a light accent which took a little time to adjust to, but then it became easy to understand her. Her words were heartfelt and articulate, personal and compelling, down-to-earth although thought-provoking. And she had a delightful sense of humor, telling us about how a vocational test that she took in high school suggested that she become a nun! But most importantly, Rabbi Sonia Saltzman talked about humility and the

rabbinic traits that she hoped to emulate, and her wishes for our community. She admired the rabbinic teaching that we should not think too highly of ourselves and, in this display of selflessness, we thought highly of her. She reminded us that one should never separate themselves from the community, nor be too quick to judge others, a fundamental basis for connection. And finally, that it was never too late to learn. These were some of the guidelines that she has attempted to live by. How fitting these words were, for Rabbi Sonia Saltzman had already begun to teach us, about herself of course and her values, but, more importantly, about how we could lead more meaningful and fulfilling lives together, guided and nurtured by our Jewish traditions and values and the connections in our community.

When Rabbi Saltzman concluded her remarks, she observed that each of us engages with our tradition in ways that feel meaningful and authentic and personal to us. She expressed her hope that she would join with this community to engage in the various paths that lead us towards lives enriched by Jewish practice and values. She pledged to help the members of TOS embrace each other -sharing in the challenges that inevitably come our way, as well as in the many joys that, she hoped, this community will be blessed to celebrate together. The optimism that she conveyed is the optimism felt by the Rabbinic Search Committee as it got to know her. It is an optimism sensed by those members of the community who have already met Rabbi Saltzman. And so we eagerly and happily look forward to Rabbi Sonia Saltzman joining our congregation in mid-August when she formally begins her new role as our rabbi.

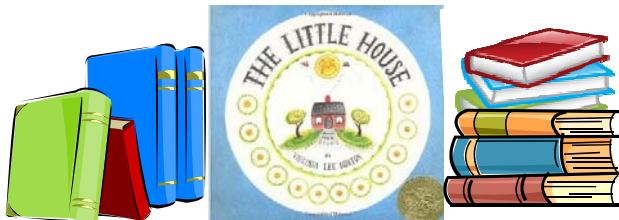
